HAWAII MIDWAY DAIKAIKÛSEN aka I Bombed Pearl Harbor (1960-Japan) 118m *** D: Shûe Matsubayashi, Hugo Grimaldi. Yôsuke Natsuki, Toshirô Mifune (YOJIMBO), Makoto Sato, Misa Uehara, Takashi Shimura. This World War II epic focuses on a group of Japanese pilots and their commanders battling in the Pacific theater. This honest and unflinching drama provides a unique Japanese perspective on two key events in history: the successful bombing of Pearl Harbor and the disastrous defeat at the Battle of Midway. This is the full length Japanese version. For ages 12 and older.

LOVE IS ALL aka Alles is liefde (2007-Netherlands) 116m *** D: Joram Lürsen. Michiel Romeyn, Thomas Acda, Anneke Blok, Carice van Houten (BLACK BOOK), Jeroen Spitzenberger, Wendy Van Dijk. Inspired by LOVE ACTUALLY, this Dutch confection is an assortment of love stories set around the Sinterklaas holiday (the feast of St Nicholas, December 5-6). This charming and funny romantic comedy won 9 awards. Suitable for ages 13 and older.

THE UNKNOWN SOLDIER aka Tuntematon sotilas (1955-Finland) 169m *** ½ D: Edvin Laine. Kosti Klemelä, Heikki Savolainen, Reino Tolvanen, Veikko Sinisalo, Pentti Siimes. This brilliant adaptation of Väinö Linna's novel focuses on the individual stories of Finnish soldiers fighting in the Continuation War (1941-1944) against the Soviet Union. The men come from different regions and backgrounds, and each has his unique perspective. This darkly humorous war epic is one of Finland's finest films. Winner of 7 awards, including one at Berlin. For ages 12 and older.

STILL MINE (2012-Canada) 102m *** D: Michael McGowan (SAINT RALPH). James Cromwell (THE QUEEN), Genevieve Bujold (KING OF HEARTS), Campbell Scott, Chuck Shamata. All farmer Craig (Cromwell) wants to do is build a little house on his plot of land in New Brunswick, Canada. He wants a more navigable home for his beloved wife, Irene (Bujold), who's beginning to show signs of dementia, but he keeps running into roadblock after roadblock. This uplifting tribute to marital devotion won 3 awards. Rated PG-13.

NADA SÔ SÔ (2006-Japan) 118m *** D: Nobuhiro Doi (BE WITH YOU). Satoshi Tsumabuki (WATERBOYS), Masami Nagasawa (CRYING OUT LOVE IN THE CENTER OF THE WORLD), Kumiko Asô (SUITE DREAMS). Bound together as siblings when 8-year-old Yotaro's mother married 3-year-old Kaoru's father, Yotaro swore to his dying mother that he would always look after his adopted little sister. Fifteen years later, Kaoru (Nagasawa) is now a beautiful young woman, and Yotaro's (Tsumabuki) posh girlfriend Keiko (Asô) is feeling neglected. This two-hankie romance set in Okinawa was nominated for 2 awards. For ages 12 and older.

ARGO (2012-US) 130m **** D: Ben Affleck (THE TOWN). Ben Affleck, Alan Arkin, John Goodman, Bryan Cranston. This ridiculously entertaining thriller is based on a true story: In 1980, six American diplomatic personnel are smuggled out of Iran disguised as a Canadian film crew shooting a sci-fiflick called Argo. The man who carries out this wildly far-fetched plan, CIA operative Tony Mendez (Affleck), has to convince both Hollywood and the frightened fugitives— just for starters. ARGO won 65 awards, including 3 Oscars. This is the special "declassified" extended version. Rated R.

RIDING UP FRONT aka Schöner Leben (2006-Germany) 104m *** D: Markus Herling (feature debut). Karin Düwel, Klaus Gehrke, Susanne Ugé, Andreas Günther. The stories of four sets of people intersect on Christmas Eve in Berlin. A woman spends a day with a train conductor filming a video for a child in Africa. A single mom makes an impossible promise to her kids. A father agrees to meet his son for dinner. Joseph yearns for Mary. It's an ordinary day. Or is it? Nominated for one award. For ages 12 and older.

ENTRE SES MAINS (2005-France/Belgium) 90m *** ½ D: Anne Fontaine (COCO BEFORE CHANEL). Benoît Poelvoorde (MAN BITES DOG), Isabelle Carré (ROMANTICS ANONYMOUS), Jonathan Zaccaï. Married insurance agent Claire (Carré) finds herself strangely drawn to client Laurent (Poelvoorde), an unmarried veterinarian. The news reports that a serial killer is terrorizing their city of Lille, and the more Claire gets to know Laurent, the more she suspects him. This intricate mystery/thriller/romance, which takes place during the Christmas holidays, was nominated for 6 awards. For ages 15 and older.

A TIME FOR DEFIANCE aka La hora de los valientes (1998-Spain) 120m *** D: Antonio Mercero. Gabino Diego (¡AY, CARMELA!), Leonor Watling (TALK TO HER), Adriana Ozores, Luis Cuenca. Museum docent Manuel (Diego) removes Francisco de Goya's self-portrait from the Prado Museum in Madrid to protect it from damage during the Spanish Civil War. Manuel is assisted by his friends, family and sweetheart who have their hands full protecting the painting. This tragicomedy won 7 awards. For ages 12 and older.

THE SNOWS OF KILIMANJARO Les neiges du Kilimandjaro (2011-France) 107m *** D: Robert Guédiguian (MARIUS AND JEANNETTE). Jean-Pierre Daroussin (CONVERSATIONS WITH MY GARDENER), Ariane Ascaride. Idealistic trade unionist Michel (Daroussin) puts himself on the list of dockworkers to be randomly chosen for downsizing. When his name is picked, he graciously prepares for early retirement. But soon after his retirement party, Michel and his wife Marie-Claire (Ascaride) are robbed by a former co-worker. How will Michel and Marie-Claire respond? Winner of 5 awards. For ages 12 and older.

THE HUNT aka Jagten (2012-Denmark) 115m **** D: Thomas Vinterberg (THE CELEBRATION). Mads Mikkelsen (AFTER THE WEDDING), Thomas Bo Larsen, Annika Wedderkopp. Divorced Danish kindergarten teacher Lucas (Mikkelsen) is struggling over the custody of his son. Soon after he receives good news about his son, Lucas's life is shattered by a vicious rumor. This brilliantly acted drama won 11 awards from around the world, including 3 at Cannes. Rated R.

EXIT (2006-Sweden) 100m *** D: Peter Lindmark. Mads Mikkelsen (CASINO ROYALE), Alexander Skarsgård, Samuel Fröler, Kirsti Eline Torhaug, Börje Ahlstedt. When Wilhelm (Ahlstedt), the senior partner of a venture capital company is found dead, all fingers point to his protégé Thomas (Mikkelsen) as the man most likely to profit from Wilhelm's murder. Family man Thomas tries desperately to clear his name, but the killer begins to close in, endangering everything Thomas holds dear. This complex thriller set in Sweden's cutthroat business world hides a surprise or two within its twists and turns. For ages 15 and older.

A GHOST OF A CHANCE aka Sutekina kanashibari (2011-Japan) 143m *** D: Kôki Mitani (THE MAGIC HOUR). Toshiyuki Nishida, Eri Fukatsu, Hiroshi Abe, Tadanobu Asano (THOR), Kiichi Nakai. Bumbling lawyer Emi Hosho (Fukatsu) convinces the 400-year-old ghost of samurai Rokubei Sarashina (Nishida) to appear in court as the only witness to a crime. The problem is, only a select few can see or hear Rokubei. This highly inventive supernatural comedy won a Nikkan Sports Film Award for Nishida's blustering/kindly performance. For ages 10 and older.

ANOTHER FINE MESS (1930-US) 28m **** D: James Parrott. Stan Laurel, Oliver Hardy, James Finlayson. Running from the police, homeless vagabonds Stan (Laurel) and Ollie (Hardy) hide in a vacant mansion and get themselves in a fine mess! A splendid sketch by one of America's favorite comedy duos. For kids of all ages.

EMIL AND THE DETECTIVES aka Emil und die Detektive (1931-Germany) 69m *** ½ D: Gerhard Lamprecht. Rolf Wenkhaus, Fritz Rasp, Olga Engl. While on a train to Berlin, young Emil (Wenkhaus) is robbed of the money he's supposed to give to his granny (Engl). Emil befriends fellow youngsters in Berlin who use their unique talents to help Emil catch the creepy thief (Rasp). This delightful adaptation of Erich Kästner's novel was co-written by Billy Wilder and Emeric Pressberger. For kids of all ages.

SEAGULL DINER aka Kamome shokudô (2006-Japan) 102m *** D: Naoko Ogigami (GLASSES). Satomi Kobayashi, Hairi Katagiri, Masako Motai, Jarkko Niemi, Tarja Markus, Markku Peltola. Leaving her home in Japan, Sachie opens a restaurant in Finland to serve "Japanese soul food" in the land of the midnight sun. A charming tale that celebrates work, friendship and community, SEAGULL DINER will bring a smile to your face. Suitable for ages 10 and older.

THE INTOUCHABLES (2011-France) 112m ****
D: Olivier Nakache, Eric Toledano. François
Cluzet (TELL NO ONE), Omar Sy (MICMACS),
Anne Le Ny, Audrey Fleurot, Clotilde Mollet. This
hugely uplifting true story details the unlikely
friendship of quadriplegic white aristocrat
Philippe (Cluzet) and Senegalese immigrant excon Driss (Sy). A worldwide hit, this culture-clash
comedy won 16 awards and was nominated for a
Golden Globe. Rated R.

PELICAN MAN aka Pelikaanimies (2004-Finland) 84m *** ½ D: Liisa Helminen. Kari Ketonen, Roni Haarakangas, Inka Nuorgam, Jonna Järnefelt, Anu Viheriäranta. Young Emil (Haarakangas) discovers that a mysterious new visitor in town (Ketonen) is a pelican in disguise. Opera-loving "Mr. Berd" wants to learn the ways of humans, partly because he's fallen in love with bird-like ballerina Helena (Viheriäranta). This lovely bit of Finnish whimsy won 7 awards. For children of all ages.

A CHRISTMAS CAROL (1951-British) 86m ***** D: Brian Desmond-Hurst. Alastair Sim, Jack Warner, George Cole, Kathleen Harrison, Mervyn Johns, Michael Hordern. Still the best, this heartfelt and faithful rendition of the Dickens classic features a delightful performance by Sim as Scrooge, a surly old miser who is visited one evening by ghosts who teach him the spirit of Christmas. The perfect holiday movie. For all ages.

NOTHING SPECIAL (2010-US) 100m *** D: Angela Garcia Combs (debut feature). Julia Garcia Combs, Karen Black, Barbara Bain, David Hardie, Carlos De Antonis. Louise (Julia Garcia Combs) is an up-and-coming insurance executive who dreams of being interviewed by Oprah or winning a Nobel Prize, but resigns herself to be "nothing special". Hollywood resident Louise has to contend with a bi-polar mom (Black), an operatic tenor for a neighbor (De Antonis), a demanding job, and her feelings for a guy (Hardie). This smart and funny tale is something special. For ages 15 and older

HOME FROM HOME aka Endstation der Sehnsüchte (2009-Germany/South Korea) 96m **** D: Sung Hyung Cho. This fascinating documentary tells the story of three Korean women, all with German husbands, who, after 30 years in Europe, return to the land of their birth. All three women discover that Korea no longer feels like home, and retreat to the comforts of a German expat village in Korea that has, among other things, red tile roofs and sausage vendors. Humorous and thought-provoking, this film provides unique insight into human values. For ages 10 and older.

THREE WIVES aka Tre mogli (2001-Italy/Spain/Argentina) 105m *** D: Marco Risi. Franceska d'Aloja, Silke, Iaia Forte, Claudio Gregori. Three Roman wives of very different backgrounds are joined in a common cause. Why? All of their husbands left them on New Year's Eve; all three husbands work at the same bank (which is missing a huge amount of cash); and all three wives are flying to Argentina in pursuit of their spouses. This comedy-drama was nominated for 3 awards. For ages 15 and older.

L'UOMO PERFETTO (2005-Italy/UK) 92m ***
D: Luca Lucini. Francesca Inaudi (AFTER MIDNIGHT), Riccardo Scamarcio (THE BEST OF
YOUTH), Gabriella Pession, Giampaolo Morelli
(GINGER AND CINNAMON). In this zesty romantic comedy, Lucia (Inaudi) has been in love with
her best friend Maria's (Pession) boyfriend Paolo
(Morelli) for a long time. When Maria announces
her engagement to marry Paolo, Lucia pays
scruffy but cute actor Antonio (Scamarcio) to lure
Maria away from Paolo. Things don't quite go as
planned... Winner of an award for Scamarcio. For
ages 15 and older.
