MR. PIP (2012-Papua New Guinea/Australia/New Zealand) 116m *** ½ D: Andrew Adamson (SHREK). Hugh Laurie, Kerry Fox, Xzannjah Matsi, Eka Darville, Florence Korokoro. In 1989, civil war rages in the province of Bougainville in Papua New Guinea. Mr. Watts (Laurie) is the only white man left after the blockade. Watts re-opens the local school and shares his love of Dickens's *Great Expectations* by reading it out loud for the children. In 14-year-old Matilda's (Matsi) mind, the characters become real, creating a world of imagination to help her cope with the destruction around her. This heartfelt film won 6 awards. Rated PG-13 (this is NOT a children's film).

DALECARLIANS *aka Masjävlar* (2004-Sweden) 98m *** D: Maria Blom (debut). Sofia Helin, Kajsa Ernst, Ann Petré, Unwed Stockholm computer analyst Mia (Helin) returns to her snowy rural hometown of Dalecarlia after being away 15 years to celebrate her father's 70th birthday. Mia quickly re-acquaints herself with her quirky family and the residents of the town, but when her parents offer Mia a plot of land near the lake to build a summer home, her sisters feel quite put out. This charming comedy-drama won 4 awards. For ages 12 and older.

ENDING NOTE: DEATH OF A JAPANESE SALARYMAN (2011-Japan) 90m **** D: Mami Sunada. This intimate and deeply moving documentary concerns Tokyo businessman Tomoaki Sunada, who is diagnosed with cancer just as he is beginning to enjoy his retirement. A highly meticulous man and a positive thinker, Sunada puts together a plan for the end of his life. Humorous and life affirming, Tomoaki's story is tenderly documented by his youngest daughter Mami Sunada. Winner of 3 awards. For ages 12 and older.

THE HUNDRED-FOOT JOURNEY (2014-India/United Arab Emirates/US) 122m *** ½ D: Lasse Hallström (HACHI: A DOG'S TALE). Helen Mirren, Om Puri, Manish Dayal, Charlotte Le Bon, Michel Blanc. Escaping political violence and personal loss in Mumbai, widowed Papa Kadam (Puri) and his children arrive in France, scouting for a place to open a restaurant. Fate lands the Kadam family directly across the street from the culinary temple of Madam Mallory (Mirren). A fierce rivalry develops between the two restaurants until sparks of romance begin to form a bridge. This charmer features delightful battles between acting greats Mirren and Puri. Rated PG.

COPENHAGEN (2014-Canada/US/Denmark) 98m ***½ D: Mark Raso (debut). Gethin Anthony, Frederikke Dahl Hansen, Sebastian Armesto. Twenty-eight-year-old William (Anthony) travels from New York to Copenhagen to locate a grandfather he never met. When William gets hotel intern Effy (Hansen) to help him locate his grandfather, he doesn't realize she's half his age. It turns out that Effy has a thing or two to teach the rude American about maturity in this gorgeous, candid and thoughtful romance. Winner of 5 awards. Unrated.

ANTIQUE BAKERY *aka Sayangkoldong yangkwajajeom aentikeu* (2008-South Korea) 107m *** D: Kyu-dong Min (MEMENTO MORI). Ji-hun Ju, Jae-wook Kim, Ji-ho Choi, Ah In Yoo. Rich straight guy Jin-hyeok (Ju) opens a patisserie in an old antique store and hires brilliant pastry chef Seon-woo (Kim), even though the chef's had a mad crush on Jin-hyeok since high school. This odd couple is joined by ex-boxing champ Ki-beom (Yoo) and clueless bodyguard Su-yeong (Choi) bringing the count of cute guys to four. When the pastry shop attracts girls as planned, this Korean comedy drama twists into an upbeat thriller. Winner of 1 award. For ages 15 and older.

DINNER RUSH (2000-US) 99m *** ½ D: Bob Giraldi (HID-ING OUT). Danny Aiello, Edoardo Gero, Kirk Acevedo, Vivian Wu. An explosive mix of Manhattan socialites and underworld figures comes together one fateful evening in a popular TriBeCa restaurant. Louis (Aiello) is the trattoria's owner—he's also a bookie in trouble. The mob wants a piece of Louis's thriving restaurant business, and Louis can't bear to tell this to his son and chef Udo (Ballerini). This dynamite foodie crime drama was shot in director Giraldi's real restaurant, Gigino. Don't miss it! Winner of 2 awards. Rated R.

L'ISOLA (2003-Italy) 103m *** D: Costanza Quatriglio. Veronica Guarrasi, Ignacio Ernandes, Marcello Mazzarella, Erri De Luca. In this neo-realist slice of life on a small Sicilian island, Teresa (Guarrasi) and her older teenage brother Turi (Ernandes) face the end of childhood and the onset of adult responsibility in this beautiful and thought-provoking drama. Winner of 3 awards, including one at Cannes. For ages 12 and older.

OSCAR AND THE LADY IN PINK *aka Oscar et la dame rose* (2009-France/Belgium/Canada) 105m *** ½ D: Eric-Emmanuel Schmitt (MONSIEUR IBRAHIM). Michèle Laroque, Amir Ben Abdelmoumen, Max von Sydow. Oscar (Ben Abdelmoumen) is a 10-year-old cancer patient. He's furious that his parents won't tell him the truth about his condition, and irked that the hospital staff forgives all his pranks. But one afternoon, Oscar meets Rose (Laroque)—an attractive yet tough, straight-talking, pizza-making storyteller *who's also a former wrestler*—and he's instantly her fan. This delightfully imaginative story is perfect for the holiday season. Nominated for 4 awards. For ages 10 and older.

THE GIVEN WORD *aka O Pagador de Promessas* (1962-Brazil) 98m **** D: Anselmo Duarte. Leonardo Villar, Glória Menezes, Dionísio Azevedo, Geraldo Del Rey. Country bumpkin Zé makes a promise at a Candomblé ritual to carry a cross as big as Christ's to the altar of Saint Barbara in return for his best friend's health. Miraculously, his friend heals completely, and devout Zé makes the 10 mile journey to Bahia (Brazil), only to have his piety grossly misinterpreted by everyone, including the priest. This rare, visually exquisite film with its brilliant music (samba, berimbau, etc.) won at Cannes and was nominated for an Oscar. For ages 10 and older.

GUARDIANS OF THE GALAXY (2014-US/UK) 121m **** D: James Gunn. Chris Pratt, Zoe Saldana, Dave Bautista, Vin Diesel, Bradley Cooper, Lee Pace. This deliciously irreverent Marvel space epic centers on treasure hunter Peter Quill (Pratt), whose recent acquisition of a mysterious orb makes him the target of intergalactic villain Ronan the Accuser (Pace). Ronan wants to use the orb to destroy Peter's home galaxy. Quill is joined by a wisecracking raccoon (Cooper), a tree (Diesel), green-skinned assassin Gamora (Saldana) and bereaved big guy Drax (Bautista) to help defend the galaxy from Ronan and company. We predict some Oscars for this one. Rated PG-13.

SMALL CRIME *aka Mikro eglima* (2008-Germany/Cyprus/Greece) 85m *** D: Christos Georgiou (UNDER THE STARS). Aris Servetalis, Vicky Papadopoulou. Though Leonidas (Servetalis) dreams of being a big city cop in Athens, he's assigned to a remote island (Therasia) on the Aegean Sea. But even here he can't keep law and order—people work without permits and sunbathe in the nude with impunity. When the body of a former soccer star is found on the rocky cliffs, Leonidas finds his chance to solve a mystery. Enjoy a little Greek vacation by watching this comic mystery romance. For ages 15 and older.

EL CANTOR (2005-France) 90m *** D: Joseph Morder (feature debut). Lou Castel, Luis Rego, Françoise Michaud, Talila, Alexandra Stewart. When New Yorker Clovis Fishermann (Castel) visits his cousin William Stern (Rego) in picturesque Le Havre, they re-live youthful escapades from when they last met 30 years ago. William's wife, grieving the loss of her father, is in no mood for their fun and games. But soon, Clovis, the descendant of great cantors, begins to reveal the purpose of his visit. This thoughtful drama, which features incredibly beautiful Klezmer music, won the Jewish Experience Award at the Jerusalem Film Festival. For ages 12 and older.

CANONE INVERSO – MAKING LOVE (2000-Italy) 107m *** D: Ricky Tognazzi. Hans Matheson, Melanie Thierry, Lee Williams, Gabriel Byrne, Ricky Tognazzi, Peter Vaughan, Nia Roberts. In this sweepingly romantic saga that spans over 25 years, an unusual violin with a figure of a man's head sculpted into its scroll provides the key to a mystery. Raised by a Jewish single mother in the 1920s, Jenő Varga (Matheson) has no money, but has music in his hands and heart. His destiny will be marked by musical triumph, forbidden love, great friendship and the *canone inverso* his mother sang. Winner of 10 awards, 2 of them for Ennio Morricone's swoon-worthy score. It's worth it for the music alone! For ages 15 and older.

MARIUS (2013-France) 93m *** D: Daniel Auteuil (JEAN DE FLORETTE). Daniel Auteuil, Raphaël Personnaz, Jean-Pierre Darroussin, Victoire Bélézy, Marie-Anne Chazel. This Marcel Pagnol story, adapted and directed by French acting great Daniel Auteuil, is Part One of the Marseilles Trilogy. Marius (Personnaz), son of tavern owner César (Auteuil), is torn between the call of the sea and the charms of Fanny (Bélézy) the comely shellfish seller in 1920s Marseilles. This beautifully evocative drama won 2 awards. Suitable for ages 12 and older.

FANNY (2013-France) 102m *** D: Daniel Auteuil. Daniel Auteuil, Raphaël Personnaz, Jean-Pierre Darroussin, Victoire Bélézy, Marie-Anne Chazel. FANNY, Part 2 of the Marseilles Trilogy, starts just as MARIUS ends. Fanny (Bélézy) loves Marius (Personnaz), but he's off to sea on a five-year passage. When unwed Fanny finds herself pregnant with Marius's child, wealthy sail-maker Panisse (Darroussin) offers Fanny marriage, respectability and a home for her baby. Winner of 1 award. Suitable for ages 12 and older.

A CHRISTMAS CAROL (1951-UK) 86m **** D: Brian Desmond-Hurst. Alastair Sim, Jack Warner, George Cole, Kathleen Harrison, Mervyn Johns, Michael Hordern. Still the best, this heartfelt and faithful rendition of the Dickens classic features a delightful performance by Sim as Scrooge, a surly old miser who is visited one evening by ghosts who teach him the spirit of Christmas. The perfect holiday movie. For all ages.

IT ALL STARTS TODAY *aka Ça commence aujourd'hui* (1999-France) 117m ***½ D: Bertrand Tavernier (COUP DE TORCHON). Philippe Torreton, Maria Pitarresi, Nadia Kaci. Daniel (Torreton) is the schoolmaster of a kindergarten in a small French mining town. The community is impoverished and unemployment and alcoholism are rife. Daniel finds himself doing more than teaching—he's as much a social worker and fund raiser as he is a teacher. But each day Daniel finds the inspiration to continue his difficult task. This deeply moving tale about everyday heroes won 11 awards, including 3 at Berlin. For ages 12 and older.

PRIDE (2014-UK) 120m **** D: Matthew Warchus. Ben Schnetzer, Bill Nighy, Dominic West, Paddy Considine, George MacKay, Imelda Staunton, Menna Trussler. In 1984, a group of gay activists traveled from London to a rural community in South Wales to lend support to a beleaguered group of miners on strike. This uplifting true story is dramatized in this delightful film, which won an award at Cannes. Rated R.

RAMEN SAMURAI (2011-Japan) 115m *** D: Naoki Segi. Dai Watanabe, Sayaka Yamaguchi. Dai Watanabe (son of Ken) stars as Noboru, mercurial chef-owner of a ramen stand in this drama steeped in the local food culture of Kurume, Fukuoka. Though a gifted cook, drink-loving Noboru leads a tempestuous home life with his wife Yoshiko (Yamaguchi) and his son Hikaru. When Noboru dies, graphic designer Hikaru (also Watanabe), decides to take over his father's ramen stand. This colorful foodie drama is a must for ramen lovers! For ages 12 and older.

THE TRIP TO ITALY (2014-UK) 108m *** D: Michael Winterbottom (THE TRIP). Steve Coogan, Rob Brydon, Rosie Fellner. In this sequel to the foodie comedy THE TRIP, Steve (Coogan) is commissioned by *The Observer* to do a critic's tour of 6 restaurants on the Italian coast from Liguria to Capri. He asks his buddy/rival Rob (Brydon) to join him, and Rob is only too happy to leave his shaky marriage for a holiday. Along the way there are lots of witty jokes, beautiful scenery, Italian traffic jams and of course, gorgeous food. Nominated for an award. For ages 15 and older.

THERE WAS ONCE A COP *aka Il était une fois un flic...* (1972-Italy/France) 96m *** D: Georges Lautner (MONSIEUR GANGSTER). Michel Constantin, Mireille Darc. In this humorous French response to THE FRENCH CONNECTION (Constantin) infiltrates the Niçoise underworld by impersonating Louis Lopez, the brother of a deceased drug dealer. Since Lopez is married with a child, Campana sets up a fictitious family with aide Christine (Darc) posing as his wife. Comedy ensues as confirmed bachelor Campana adjusts to life as a family man while trying to battle the local mafia, American cops and hit men, and the French police! For ages 12 and older.

CHONMAGE PURIN *aka A Boy and His Samurai* (2010-Japan) 108m *** D: Yoshihiro Nakamura (FISH STORY). Ryô Nishikido, Fuku Suzuki, Rie Tomosaka, Jun Inoue. This time travel tale concerns earnest young samurai Yasube (Nishikido) who lands in present-day Tokyo. The disoriented Yasube is taken in by overworked single mom Hiroko (Tomosaka). Grateful to be off the streets, Yasube takes on Hiroko's housework and care for her adorable son Tomoya (Suzuki). While performing his house-husband duties (sans sex), Yasube develops a passion for baking. WARNING: This delightful comedy will make you hungry for dessert. For ages 10 and older.
