THE FIFTH WHEEL aka L'ultima ruota del carro (2013-Italy) 109m *** D: Giovanni Veronesi (THE MANUAL OF LOVE). Elio Germano (MY BROTHER IS AN ONLY CHILD), Alessandra Mastronardi, Ricky Memphis, Sergio Rubini. Ever since childhood, Ernesto (Germano) was told by his father he wouldn't amount to much. But when he falls in love with Angela (Mastronardi), Ernesto would move mountains to build her a happy home. Set in Rome from the 1970s to the present, Ernesto and his pals strive against the changing winds of Italian politics, economy and society. This warmly humanistic comedy-drama was nominated for 8 awards. For ages 12 and older.

AMY (2015-UK/US) 128m **** D: Asif Kapadia (SENNA). British soul star Amy Winehouse died of alcohol poisoning at age 27. This documentary combines filmed footage of Amy both commercial and private to create a portrait of an artist overwhelmed by her fame. Brilliant, defiant and fragile, Amy Winehouse the star is a phenomenon that was both created and destroyed by us, her public. This documentary won 2 awards so far. Rated R.

A DISTANT CRY FROM SPRING aka Haruka naru yama no yobigoe (1980-Japan) 123m **** D: Yôji Yamada (TWILIGHT SAMURAI). Ken Takakura (POPPOYA), Chieko Baishô (TORA-SAN series). Young widow Tamiko (Baishô) runs a dairy farm in rural Hokkaido with her 10-year-old son Takeshi. One stormy evening, a mysterious man (Takakura) arrives and helps Tamiko with the birthing of a calf. He offers to work for room and board only—and she, desperately needing help, agrees. As time passes, Tamiko and Takeshi grow to love the strong and silent man, though he is clearly hiding something. This touching love story won 8 awards. For ages 10 and older.

DENNIS P. (2007-Belgium/Netherlands) 93m *** D: Pieter Kuiipers (NOTHING TO LOSE). Edo Brunner, Nadja Hüpscher, Willeke van Ammeirooy, John Leddy. This comedy is inspired by the exploits of real life thief Dennis Phrommer, responsible for the Netherland's biggest diamond heist worth 20 million Euros. Dennis (Brunner) is a sad shlump who's shy around women. When he falls in love with Tiffany (Hüpscher), he goes a little too far in trying to impress her... This entertaining heist comedy was nominated for 3 awards. For ages 12 and older.

ASSASSINATION (2015-South Korea) 140m *** ½ D: Donghoon Choi. Ji-hyun 'Gianna' Jun, Jung-woo Ha, Jung-jae Lee, Jin-woong Jo, Byung-eun Park. This stylish adventure set in Japanese-occupied Korea in 1933 concerns three uniquely talented Korean killers assigned to assassinate Japanese Garrison Commander Kawaguchi (Park). The plans of the assassins, led by lady sniper Ahn Ok-yun (Jun), are leaked by a traitor. The three not only have to flee a Chinese prison, they must face the Japanese army and contend with sexy hitman Hawaii Pistol (Ha). Variety calls this 'as sensationally entertaining mash-up of historical drama, "Dirty Dozen" style shoot-'em-up, [and] spaghetti Western-flavored flamboyance". For ages 15 and older.

DECONSTRUCTING HARRY (1997-US) 96m *** ½ D: Woody Allen (MIGHTY APHRODITE). Woody Allen, Judy Davis, Julia Louis-Dreyfus, Elisabeth Shue, Kirstie Alley, Robin Williams, Billy Crystal. This hilariously vulgar black comedy concerns a writer named Harry (Allen) whose personal life is a mess because he writes about his family and friends' most embarrassing details in his novels. Judaism, psychiatry and marital fidelity all get hopelessly mangled against the backdrop of New York City. Winner of 2 awards and nominated for a Best Screenplay Oscar. Rated R.

A MATTER OF LIFE AND DEATH aka Stairway to Heaven (1946-UK) 104m **** D: Michael Powell, Emeric Pressburger. David Niven, Kim Hunter, Raymond Massey, Richard Attenborough, Roger Livesey. A British bomber is going down in flames in the last days of WWII. Peter (Niven), the pilot, is on the radio with ground controller June (Hunter). The Brit and the Yank feel a strong emotional connection before Peter jumps out of the plane. Miraculously, Peter survives, meets June and falls in love. But—Heaven has made a mistake. Peter wasn't meant to survive, and now his fate will be determined by a heavenly court! Winner of a Bodil Award. For all ages.

MISTRESS AMERICA (2015-US) 84m *** ½ D: Noah Baumbach (FRANCES HA). Greta Gerwig, Lola Kirke, Michael Chernus, Matthew Shear. It's Tracy's (Kirke) first year at New York's Barnard College and she's a bit overwhelmed. Tracy decides to contact her sister-to-be Brooke (Gerwig), whose dad is due to marry Tracy's mom. Interior designer-restaurateurfitness instructor Brooke, who seems to have New York wrapped around her little finger, readily takes Tracy under her wing. Led by Brooke, the two get in a whirlwind of trouble in this screwball comedy masterpiece. Nominated for a Gotham Award. Rated R. ANT-MAN (2015-US) 117m *** ½ D: Peyton Reed (YES MAN). Paul Rudd (I LOVE YOU, MAN), Michael Peña, Michael Douglas, Evangeline Lilly, Corey Stoll, Bobby Cannavale, Anthony Mackie. This Marvel superhero-origin story begins in 1989, when particle physicist Hank Pym (Douglas) invents a weapons technology highly coveted by S.H.I.E.L.D. A quarter century later, cat burglar Scott Lang (Rudd) breaks into Pym's safe and experiences the technology first hand... by shrinking to the size of an ant. This playful and unpretentious sci-fi adventure was nominated for 2 awards. Rated PG-13.

A FEAST AT MIDNIGHT (1994-UK) 102m *** ½ D: Justin Hardy. Freddie Findlay, Christopher Lee, Edward Fox, Andrew Lusher, Lisa Faulkner, Carol MacReady. Christopher Lee lends his trademark menace to his role as stern Latin teacher Maj. Longfellow aka "The Raptor". The scourge of his strict English boarding school, the Raptor denies 10-year-old Magnus (Findlay) a visit to see his ailing father (Fox). As an act of defiance, Magnus forms a secret society dedicated to making delicious desserts. Magnus and his friends use their ingenuity to create contraband crème caramel aux fraises and other delights, proving revenge can be sweet indeed. Ages 10 and older.

POPULAIRE (2012-France/Belgium) 111m *** D: Régis Roinsard (feature debut), Romain Duris (L'AUBERGE ESP-AGNOLE). Déborah François, Bérénice Bejo (THE ARTIST), Shaun Benson. This delightful French tribute to the 1950s Hollywood romantic comedy has doe-eyed Rose (François) traveling to Normandy to apply for a job so she can escape a life of drudgery as a housewife. Her interview is a disaster, but the boss Louis (Duris) is blown away by Rose's typing speed. Rose develops a crush on handsome Louis, but he only sees her as world-class typing champion! How fast will she go to win his heart? Winner of an award. Rated R.

FATHER BROWN aka The Detective (1954-UK) 91m *** D: Robet Hamer (KIND HEARTS AND CORONETS). Alec Guinness, Joan Greenwood, Peter Finch, Cecil Parker, Bernard Lee. Father Brown (Guinness) is a part-time sleuth who is more interested in saving souls than getting criminals locked up in prison. When master thief Gustave Flambeau (Finch) steals a holy relic that Brown is transporting to Rome, the priest resolves to get the relic back and make the suave thief repent his wicked ways! This crime comedy won an award from the National Board of Review. For all ages. PLAYS WITH:

THE AVENGERS: The Interrogators (1969-UK) 50m **** D: Charles Crichton (THE LAVENDER HILL MOB). Patrick Macnee (A CHRISTMAS CAROL), Linda Thorson, Christopher Lee, David Sumner, Patrick Newell. This episode of The Avengers is a hilarious spoof of THE MANCHURIAN CANDIDATE with a cheerfully malevolent Christopher Lee as the villain. Note: Christopher Lee (5/27/1922 – 6/7/2015) and Patrick Macnee (2/6/1922 – 6/25/2015) were classmates and performed in school plays together. For ages 12 and older.

ME AND EARL AND THE DYING GIRL (2015-US) 105m ***** D: Alfonso Gomez-Rejon. Thomas Mann (PROJECT X), RJ Cyler, Olivia Cooke, Nick Offerman, Connie Britton, Molly Shannon. Pittsburgh high school student Greg (Mann) is forced by his mom (Britton) to visit Rachel (Cooke), a classmate he barely knows who has been diagnosed with leukemia. With fellow movie geek Earl (Cyler), Greg explores uncharted territory with Rachel: real friendship. This funny and moving tearjerker won 12 awards all the way from Bali to Zaereb. Rated PG-13.

MESSY CHRISTMAS aka Meine schöne Bescherung (2007-Germany) 90m *** D: Vanessa Jopp. Martina Gedeck (MOSTLY MARTHA), Heino Ferch, Jasmin Tabatabai, Meret Becker, Rainer Sellien. Sara (Gedeck) surprises her husband Jan (Ferch) by inviting her three ex-husbands for Christmas. At the party, Sara reveals that she's pregnant. But what Sara doesn't know is that Jan has had a vasectomy! Who is the baby's dad? This comedy of errors won an award. For ages 15 and older.

MISSION: IMPOSSIBLE – ROGUE NATION (2015-US/Hong Kong/China) 131m **** ½ D: Christopher McQuarrie (JACK REACHER). Tom Cruise, Jeremy Renner, Simon Pegg, Rebecca Ferguson, Alec Baldwin, Ving Rhames. Gotta hand it to Tom Cruise—after 20 years of Impossible Missions the guy still looks great without a shirt. In this (fifth) time out for Ethan Hunt (Cruise), he's forced to go after a criminal organization called The Syndicate alone, as the CIA, headed by Alan Hunley (Baldwin), has dismantled Hunt's IMF (not the International Monetary Fund). This top-notch thriller won an award. Rated PG-13.

MINDER: Another Bride, Another Groom (1982-UK) 52m **** D: Mike Vardy. George Cole, Dennis Waterman. Though British character actor George Cole (4/22/1925-8/5/2015) was loved for his portrayal as 'Flash' Harry in the ST. TRINIAN series of films, Cole reached the pinnacle of comic achievement as lovable yet infuriating con-man Arthur in the hit British TV series MINDER. This episode, in which Arthur organizes his niece's wedding, is one of the best.

PLAYS WITH:

MINDER ON THE ORIENT EXPRESS (1985-UK) 106m **** // D: Francis Megahy. Dennis Waterman, George Cole (A CHRISTMAS CAROL), Glynn Edwards, Peter Childs, Honor Blackman, Ralph Bates. In this feature length special based on the hit TV series Minder, Terry (Waterman), happy to be free of his con-man boss Arthur Daley (Cole), anticipates a vacation with his girlfriend on the fabled Orient Express. Imagine Terry's surprise when his roguish employer shows up on the train! For ages 12 and up.

A CHRISTMAS CAROL (1951-UK) 86m **** D: Brian Desmond-Hurst. Alastair Sim, Jack Warner, George Cole, Patrick Macnee, Kathleen Harrison, Mervyn Johns, Michael Hordern. Still the best, this heartfelt and faithful rendition of the Dickens classic features a delightful performance by Sim as Scrooge, a surly old miser who is visited one evening by ghosts who teach him the spirit of Christmas. The perfect holiday movie. For all ages.

PAWN SACRIFICE (2014-US) 115m *** ½ D: Edward Zwick (GLORY). Tobey Maguire, Liev Schreiber, Peter Sarsgaard. It is 1972. The United States in embroiled in the Vietnam War, reeling from the Watergate scandal and chilled by the Cold War with the USSR. All eyes are on one man who might deliver victory to the Americans: Bobby Fischer (Maguire). The chessboard becomes an international battlefield in this fascinating tale of American chess prodigy Fischer and his legendary match with Russian master Boris Spassky (Schreiber). Rated PG-13.

CIAO BELLA (2007-Sweden) 86m *** D: Mani Maserrat Agah (directorial debut). Poyan Karimi, Chanelle Lindell, Oliver Wahlgren-Ingrosso. At a high school tournament, nerdy Swedish teen of Iranian descent Mustafa (Karimi) befriends Enrico (Wahlgren-Ingrosso), a member of an Italian soccer team. Enrico teaches Mustafa the Italian art of seduction. Now calling himself "Massimo", Mustafa catches the eye of lovely Linnea (Lindell), who believes him to be a sexy Italian. How to tell Linnea the truth and keep her love? This charmer was nominated for an award at the Palm Springs International Film Festival. For ages 15 and older.

DE MARATHON (2012-Netherlands) 107m *** ½ D: Diederick Koopal. Stefan de Walle, Martin van Waardenberg, Marcel Hensema, Frank Lammers, Mimoun Oaïssa. Three car mechanics discover that the owner of their auto repair shop, Gerard (de Walle), owes 40,000 Euros in taxes. Worried they'll lose the garage, the four decide to raise the money through running the Rotterdam Marathon. But there's a catch: their sponsor stipulates that all four must finish the marathon or they won't get paid--and all four are fat, out-of-shape smokers with only six months to train before the big event! This rousing comedy-drama won 3 awards. For ages 15 and older.

YOU'RE THE ONE (2000-Spain) 108m *** D: José Luis Garci (THE GRANDFATHER). Lydia Bosch, Julia Gutiérrez Caba, Juan Diego, Ana Fernández, Manuel Lozano. Writer Julia (Bosch), suffering from depression, leaves Madrid and travels to her childhood home in Asturias in this gorgeously filmed black and white drama set in the 1940s. This film's title, derived from the Cole Porter tune Night and Day, hints at Julia's heartache. As village life begins to reinvigorate her, Julia in turn shares her talent with the community. Delightful characters include wisecracking Tia Gala (Caba) and sassy little Juanito (Lozano). Winner of 13 awards. For ages 10 and older.

A WALK IN THE WOODS (2015-US) 104m *** D: Ken Kwapis (BIG MIRACLE). Robert Redford, Nick Nolte, Emma Thompson, May Steenburgen, Nick Offerman. This delightful road (trail?) comedy adapted from travel writer Bill Bryson's book is about a happily married man (Redford) who challenges himself on the Appalachian Trail with his long lost friend Katz (Nolte), who's just trying to get out of his troubles with the law. In the book, the gents involved are in their forties. In this film, the protagonists are in their seventies. To say nothing of their friendship, will they survive the 2100 mile trek? Rated R.
