RED PEONY GAMBLER *aka Hibotan bakuto* (1968-Japan) 98m *** D: Kōsaku Yamashita. Sumiko Fuji, Ken Takakura, Tomisaburō Wakayama, Kyōsuke Machida. In this first film of the RED PEONY series, beautiful young O-Ryu (Fuji) is the heir to a yakuza clan who seeks to avenge her slain father. She is a skilled gambler and fears no man, but she has no idea who killed her father. She meets a handsome wanderer named Katagiri (Takakura) who holds the key to the killer's identity, but he has reasons to keep silent in this terrific thriller. For ages 12 and older.

INSPECTOR GEORGE GENTLY: GENTLY WITH THE WOMEN (2015-UK) 92m *** D: Roger Goldby. Martin Shaw, Lee Ingleby, Lisa McGrillis, Derek Riddell, Annabel Scholey. While investigating a rape case, Inspector George Gently (Shaw) learns from young detective Rachel Coles (McGrillis) that Inspector Walter Nunn (Riddell) has been dissuading rape victims from pressing charges. To make matters even more complicated, Sgt. Bacchus (Ingleby), is having an affair with Nunn's wife (Scholey). For ages 15 and older.

THE BROKENWOOD MYSTERIES: PLAYING THE LIE (2014-New Zealand) 86m *** ½ D: Michael Hurst. Neill Rea, Fern Sutherland, Pana Hema Taylor, Cristina Serban Ionda, Roz Turnbull. A morning round of golf of several Brokenwood Golf Club committee members is interrupted when fellow committee member Alison Stone (Turnbull) collapses and dies on the golf course, her face red and covered with blisters. To solve the crime, Detectives Shepherd (Rea) and Sims (Sutherland) probe into Brokenwood's colorful golf community. For ages 12 and older.

NERO WOLFE: THE SILENT SPEAKER (2002-US) 88m **** D: Michael Jaffe. Timothy Hutton, Maury Chaykin, Bill Smitrovich, Cynthia Watros, James Tolkan, George Plimpton. It is 1946, shortages are common in the post-war US, and price controls are in the hands of the National Industrial Association (NIA). When Cheney Boone, the leader of the rival Bureau of Price Regulations (BPR), is found bludgeoned to death, the NIA is immediately suspected of causing the murder. Armchair sleuth Nero Wolfe (Chaykin), too broke to refuse this politically toxic case, finds suspects from both organizations and even one from the FBI (Tolkan). For ages 15 and older.

SONG OF THE GENKAI SEA *aka Genkai tsurezure-bushi* (1986-Japan) 135m *** D: Masanobu Deme. Sayuri Yoshinaga, Aki Yashiro, Morio Kazama, Toshiro Mifune, Kirin Kiki, Yūsuke Okada. When Yuki's (Yoshinaga) wealthy husband abruptly disappears, leaving her with a mountain of debt and an illegitimate spoiled brat, she travels to her hometown of Kita-Kyushu to find answers in this lively comedy-drama. She is helped by a childhood friend (Kazama) and Tsukiyo (pop star Aki Yashiro), a woman from Yuki's husband's past. For ages 12 and older.

THE BROKENWOOD MYSTERIES: HUNTING THE STAG (2014-New Zealand) 91m *** ½ D: Mike Smith. Neill Rea, Fern Sutherland, Pana Hema Taylor, Karl Willetts, Jared Turner. Three friends, one of whom is about to be married, go deer hunting in the bush. The groom-to-be is shot in the head in what seems to be a hunting accident. But how can it be that he was shot by his own rifle from 50 meters away? This intriguing mystery filmed in Puhoi, New Zealand is terrifically entertaining. For ages 12 and older.

JERRY AND MARGE GO LARGE (2022-US) 96m *** D: David Frankel (THE DEVIL WEARS PRADA). Bryan Cranston, Annette Bening, Rainn Wilson, Larry Wilmore. Jerry (Cranston) and Marge (Bening) Selbee live in a small Michigan town. After a 40-year career Jerry is now retired, but restless. When they discover a loophole in the rules of a local lottery game, Jerry and Marge use their lottery winnings to revitalize their town in this feel-good true story. Rated PG-13.

ALI & AVA (2021-UK) 91m *** D: Clio Barnard. Adeel Akhtar, Claire Rushbrook, Shaun Thomas. In this romance set in West Yorkshire, Ali (Akhtar) is reeling with the breakdown of his marriage. He's miserable living under the same roof with his wife despite their estrangement. But he is an ebullient, kind soul, which is noticed by kindergarten teacher Ava (Rushbrook) when Ali picks up his tenant's child from her school. Ava is warm and loving, though she has suffered a number of bad relationships. From vastly different backgrounds and difficult families, the two connect and strive to find joy. Winner of 5 awards. For ages 12 and older.

A TALE OF SAMURAI COOKING: A TRUE LOVE STORY (2013-Japan) 122m *** D: Yūzō Asahara. Aya Ueto, Kengo Kōra, Toshiyuki Nishida (A GHOST OF A CHANCE), Kimiko Yo. Since his older brother's unexpected death, Yasunobu (Kōra) is being groomed to become chef to the Kaga daimyo in Edo-period Japan. This is an exalted position—and hereditary in his samurai class family. But Yasunobu has his heart set on being a warrior: he can't bear trading his sword for a cooking knife. His father (Nishida) has a solution. He's found the perfect foodie bride (Ueto) to inspire his son! Nominated for 2 awards. For ages 10 and older.

ZATOICHI ON THE ROAD *aka Zatoichi kenka-tabi* (1963-Japan) 87m *** ½ D: Kimiyoshi Yasuda. Shintarō Katsu, Shiho Fujimura, Reiko Fujiwara, Yoshio Yoshida, Sōnosuke Sawamura. Wandering blind swordsman Zatoichi (Katsu) is begged by a dying old man to deliver innocent young O-Mitsu (Fujimura) to her family in Edo. Zatoichi feels honor-bound to complete this task, but it becomes increasingly difficult when two criminal gangs discover just how wealthy her merchant family is, and they try to kidnap her for ransom. Rated PG.

TANGE SAZEN: SECRET OF THE URN *aka Tange Sazen: Hien iaigiri* (1966-Japan) 91m *** D: Hideo Gosha (GOYŌKIN). Kinnosuke Nakamura, Keiko Awaji, Wakaba Irie, Tetsurō Tanba, Isao Kimura. Popular fictional character Tange Sazen, the one-armed, one-eyed ronin, is a 1960s style antihero in this clever, cynical chamber. Tange was once an honorable and deeply loyal samurai named Samanosuke (Nakamura) who, when given the task of assassinating his childhood sweetheart's (Irie) fiancé, is horribly maimed and transforms into Tange Sazen. For ages 12 and older.

LOVE & PEACE (2015-Japan) 118m *** ½ D: Sion Sono (LOVE EXPOSURE). Hiroki Hasegawa, Kumiko Asō, Toshiyuki Nishida. Pathetic salaryman Ryōichi (Hasegawa) is constantly ridiculed at work, and even strangers point and laugh at him. But Ryōichi has always dreamed of becoming a singing star. Thanks to his co-worker Yūko (Asō), his pet turtle Pikadon and Pa (Nishida), the Santa Claus of subterranean Tokyo, his life is about to change. This wildly original Christmas odyssey won a Fantasia Film Festival award. Rated PG.

ONE CAREFUL OWNER *aka El inconveniente* (2020-Spain) 91m *** D: Bernabé Rico (feature debut). Juana Acosta, Kiti Mánver, Carlos Areces. Rigidly uptight Sarah (Acosta), a successful insurance agent, is offered the ideal apartment: spacious, bright and in one of Seville's nicest neighborhoods. According to real estate agent Óscar (Areces), there's just one "inconvenience": Sarah has to wait until the elderly owner passes away before she can move in. When Sarah meets the potty-mouthed, chain-smoking "inconvenience" Lola (Mánver), they unexpectedly become friends in this witty comedy-drama. Winner of 11 awards. For ages 12 and older.

THE REPORTS ON SARAH AND SALEEM (2018-Occupied Palestinian Territory/Germany/ Netherlands/Mexico) 127m *** ½ D: Muayad Alayan. Adeb Safadi, Sivane Kretchner, Ishaq Golan, Maisa Abd Elhadi, Jan Kühne. A Palestinian man (Safadi) and an Israeli woman who runs a café (Kretchner) are having an affair: they meet in a parking lot and have sex in his bakery delivery van. Anywhere else their affair might go unnoticed, but they live in a surveillance state. One day, they are spotted in the wrong place, and suddenly it's an international scandal. This geo-political thriller won 7 awards. For ages 15 and older.

700 DAYS OF BATTLE: US VS. THE POLICE *aka Bokutachi to chūzai-san no 700 nichi sensō* (2008-Japan) 110m *** D: Renpei Tsukamoto. Hayato Ichihara, Kurasnosuke Sasaki, Kumiko Asō, Takuya Ishida. In this breezy comedy set in a little Japanese town in 1979, the new policeman (Sasaki) penalizes high school student Saijo (Ishida) for speeding on his motor scooter. Outraged, Saijo's friends (all pranksters) led by Mamachari "Granny Bike" (Ichihara) decide to get even. Funny and heartwarming in equal measure. For ages 10 and older.

SKETCHES OF KAITAN CITY *aka Kaitanishi joken* (2010-Japan) 151m *** ½ D: Kazuyoshi Kumakiri. Mitsuki Tanimura, Pistol Takehara, Ryō Kase, Kaoru Kobayashi, Kaho Minami, Takashi Yamanaka. In the fictional city of Kaitan, stories of a changing economy unfold: Futa (Takehara) loses his shipyard job; a developer (Yamanaka) tries to convince an old lady to move; and gas canister salesman Meguro (Kase) struggles to expand his business. Meguro's neglected son finds shelter at the planetarium, whose owner (Kobayashi) also feels abandoned by his family. Filmed in bleakly beautiful Hakodate. Winner of 3 awards. For ages 15 and older.

DEAR DOCTOR (2009-Japan) 127m *** ½ D: Miwa Nishikawa (SWAY). Tsurube Shōfukutei (KABEI: OUR MOTHER), Eita, Teruyuki Kagawa, Kimiko Yo, Kaoru Yachigusa. A small rural Japanese community is in an uproar when well-loved Dr. Osamu Ino (Shōfukutei) mysteriously disappears. Two city detectives arrive to solve the case and discover that everyone in the village hides a little secret. This fascinating drama won 21 awards. For ages 12 and older.

EMOTIONAL ARITHMETIC (2007-Canada) 96m *** D: Paolo Barzman. Susan Sarandon, Christopher Plummer, Max von Sydow, Gabriel Byrne, Roy Dupuis. In this emotionally complex drama set in Quebec in 1985, Melanie Winters (Sarandon) lives on a farm with her retired professor husband David (Plummer). Melanie was interred as a teenager at Drancy, a transit station in Nazi-occupied France that sent Jews to concentration camps during WWII. Against David's wishes, she invites poet Jakob (von Sydow), who had taken Melanie under his wing while they were interred at Drancy, to stay at their home. Nominated for 7 awards. Rated PG-13.

THE BROKENWOOD MYSTERIES: A MERRY BLOODY CHRISTMAS (2016-New Zealand) 85m *** ½ D: Murray Keane. Neill Rea, Fern Sutherland, Cristina Serban Ionda, Ross McKellar. The jolly festivities of the holiday season come to a screeching halt when Brokenwood's beloved mayor, Evan Whitestone (McKellar) is found dressed in a Santa suit with his throat slit. With the local elections looming, detectives Shepherd (Rea) and Sims (Sutherland) turn their attention to Whitestone's four rival candidates. For ages 12 and older.

ACE OF ACES *aka L'as des as* (1982-France/West Germany) 102m *** D: Gérard Oury (THE BRAIN). Jean-Paul Belmondo, Marie-France Pisier, Frank Hoffmann, Günter Meisner, Rachid Ferrache. Former WWI pilot Jo Cavalier (Belmondo) is on his way to the 1936 Berlin Olympic Games as a boxing coach. On the train, he meets young Simon Rosenblum (Ferrache) who asks for Jo's autograph. When Jo discovers that his charming young fan is in danger of persecution, Jo risks everything to save Simon and his family in this rollicking adventure. For ages 10 and older.

INSPECTOR GEORGE GENTLY: SON OF A GUN (2015-UK) 93m **** D: Tim Whitby. Martin Shaw, Lee Ingleby, Lisa McGrillis, Jody Latham, Annabel Scholey. At Inspector George Gently's office Christmas party, the staff's hopeful wishes for the new decade, the 1970s, are suddenly interrupted by a violent bank robbery. Gently suspects the gang led by dangerous criminal Jonjo Burdon (Latham), but he lacks evidence. Detective Rachel Coles (McGrillis) takes on the harrowing task of going undercover to catch Burdon in this suspenseful episode. For ages 15 and older.

A CHRISTMAS CAROL (1951-UK) 86m **** D: Brian Desmond-Hurst. Alastair Sim, Jack Warner, George Cole, Patrick Macnee, Kathleen Harrison, Mervyn Johns, Michael Hordern. Still the best, this heartfelt and faithful rendition of the Dickens classic features a delightful performance by Sim as Scrooge, a surly old miser who is visited one evening by ghosts who teach him the spirit of Christmas. The perfect holiday movie for all ages.

DR. KNOCK (2017-France/Belgium) 114m *** D: Lorraine Lévy (THE OTHER SON). Omar Sy (THE INTOUCHABLES), Alex Lutz, Ana Girardot, Sabine Azéma. On the run from debt collectors, petty criminal Knock (Sy) talks his way on board a ship to India as the ship's doctor, though he's had no training whatsoever. With good luck and his gift of gab, he manages to cure his patients. Later, back on land, Dr. Knock sets up a practice in the quaint village of Saint-Maurice in this charming comedy set in 1950s provincial France. Nominated for 1 award. For ages 12 and older.

IT ALL STARTS TODAY *aka Ça commence aujourd'hui* (1999-France) 114m *** ½ D: Bertrand Tavernier. Philippe Torreton, Maria Pitarresi, Nadia Kaci, Betty Tebouille, Didier Bezace. In this very moving true story set in northern France, dedicated young head teacher Daniel Lefebvre (Torreton) tries to better the lives of his kindergarten students in a depressed coal mining town. Faced every day with problems of unemployment, drug abuse and hunger, Daniel struggles to get help from local politicians, social workers and the police who are themselves overwhelmed in this thoughtful drama. Winner of 12 awards. For ages 12 and older.
