
Congressional Art Competition

City Artwork of the Month



Kapulani Landgraf, Pu'u Kapolei Heiau, 1989 (1994.06.05)



This new section of the Kāhea newsletter will feature one piece of artwork every month as a way of building public awareness of the Art in City Buildings Program. The City has a diverse art collection that includes monuments, murals, paintings, plaques, and sculptures that are located at city venues.

This photograph *Pu'u Kapolei Heiau* (1989) by Kapulani Landgraf is part of the *Ai Pōhaku Series* documenting destroyed heiau on Oʻahu. Landgraf's work utilizes the medium of black and white photography as a way of telling *moʻolelo*, or stories of important sites of Oʻahu. Although the Pu'u Kapolei heiau structure was completely demolished, the artist visually shows that the ʻaina still holds mana or sacred power. Looking closely at the print, viewers can see black text where the artist intricately hand etched the emulsion of the negative. Utilizing this process of "etching" on the negatives references the demolished heiau structures and importantly, the text tells the history of the place that may otherwise be forgotten. This photograph tells the story of Pu'u Kapolei "hill of Kapo / Kapo – Sister of Pele."
