## *11th Annual Mayor's Remembrance Walk Sunday, September 11, 5:00 p.m.*

The procession begins with a brief ceremony at the Honolulu Police Department Headquarters on South Beretania Street. It will then continue down Alapa'i to South Street, stopping for a short service at the Honolulu Fire Department Headquarters on Queen Street. The procession will then continue on Queen and up Punchbowl Street, ending at Honolulu Hale.*

*The final ceremony will have 'oli, hula kahiko, pule, and performances by the Royal Hawaiian Band.*

*Free parking available at the Frank F. Fasi Municipal Parking Lot, at the corner of Beretania and Alapa'i.*

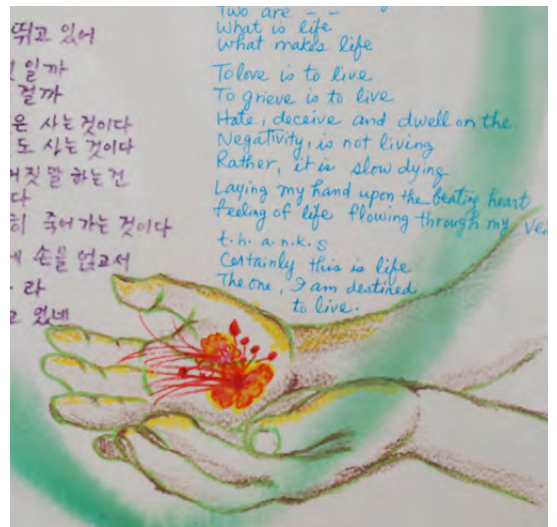
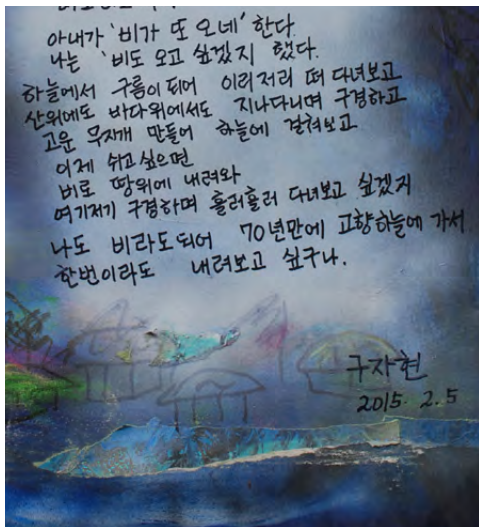

## Pamana

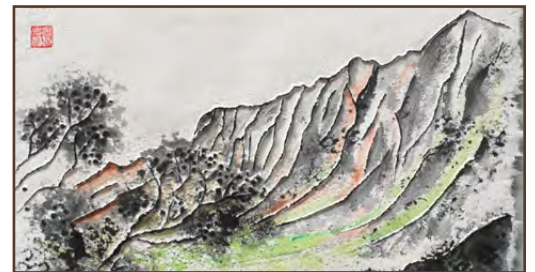
