Tyler Tokioka Assumes Leadership of the JCCH Board of Directors

For the past 25 years, the Tokioka family have been loyal members and committed volunteers to the mission of the Japanese Cultural Center of Hawaiʻi (JCCH). For decades, they have given their time unconditionally both to the Center and the diverse community that it serves. That legacy continues as Tyler Tokioka, a Sansei (third generation), takes the helm and now leads the Japanese Cultural Center of Hawaiʻi's Board of Directors.

Tyler is the second generation from his family to take an active leadership role in the Cultural Center. His father, Lionel Tokioka, and uncle, Franklin Tokioka, were instrumental in the creation and planning of JCCH more than 25 years ago.

"I was happy people placed their confidence in Tyler to lead the organization," said Tyler's father Lionel Tokioka. "It's an important role and I know he will do his best to contribute."

Tyler first became involved with the Cultural Center in 2002 when he joined the JCCH Board of Governors. He served on the board for four years before taking the lead as chairman. During his service on the Board of Governors, Tyler headed the committees of many of the Center's most notable events including the New Year's 'Ohana Festival and the annual gala dinner.



Tyler assumed a seat on the JCCH board of directors in 2008. During his term on the board, he served as chair of the Fundraising Committee and as vice chair on the Executive Committee.

"Tyler Tokioka is the right person to lead the board in the coming year as we look to develop new programs, increase membership and expand our outreach to the neighbor islands," said Carole Hayashino, president/executive director of the Japanese Cultural Center of Hawai'i. "Tyler is respectful of our past, but he is also keenly aware of the changing demographics of our community. He will help us lead the change to build a stronger organization. I am looking forward to working with him."

Tyler is currently vice president - external affairs for Island Insurance Companies. He earned a Bachelor of Arts in Business Administration from Pacific Lutheran University in Tacoma, Washington and a Master's in Business Administration from New York University Stern School of Business. He is a graduate of Punahou School.

In addition to his service to JCCH, Tyler is also a board member of the CPCU Society Hawai'i Chapter, the Honolulu Japanese Chamber of Commerce, 'Ahahui Koa Anuenue, and 'Olelo. He was also recently named one of *Hawaii Business Magazine's 20 for the Next 20: People to Watch in 2012.*



"I want to thank the Honolulu Japanese Chamber of Commerce, past chairs, board members, staff, volunteers and everyone who has brought the center to what it is today," said Tyler Tokioka, chairman of the JCCH Board of Directors. Thank You Governor Abercrombie!



Hawai'i State Governor Neil Abercrombie called it a "moment of reflection" as he signed into law Senate Bill 2678, Relating to Honouliuli, World War II Confinement Site on Friday, July 6.

SB 2678, introduced by State Senator Will Espero and co-authored by State Senator Carol Fukunaga, requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR) to establish a Honouliuli advisory group to develop recommendations for an educational resource center at the Honouliuli site; requires report to 2013 legislature; appropriates \$100,000 for the activities of the advisory group; and requires that the state funds be matched by federal, private, or other external funds.

On June 3, the Cultural Center kicked off its 25th anniversary with a special reception and unveiling of the newly renovated *Okage Sama De: I am what I am because of you* Historical Gallery.
