As we close the year and celebrate the holidays, we ask your support for Waikiki Community Center (WCC) and help make a difference in the lives of others, especially our senior adults, young children and families who reside in our community and benefit from our services. We couldn't do it without your caring support and want to share the good your contribution will accomplish. 100% of your donation remains right here in Hawaii helping those in need.

Did you know? Waikiki Community Center provides case management, counseling and referral services for our senior members, free of charge? A social worker is at the Center every Tuesday to assist with your needs. Call the office for an appointment.

Client Story Phoebe-Marie (not her real name) is an 83 year old widow who lives alone in a small Waikiki apartment. Her only son lives on Maui and rarely visits her. Mary participates in many WCC's activities which she credits to her ability to continue to live independently and with the help of her friends at WCC

Living on limited income, Mary suffers from diabetes and a chronic heart condition, both of which require her to take multiple prescription medications daily. Mary was receiving partial Medicaid health benefits and had little coverage for her medication. As a result, she would take only half of her prescribed medications and often relied on her physician to provide her with samples. Some days, she took no medications until she could afford to purchase more.

After a thorough assessment of Mary's situation, WCC's social worker helped Mary apply and receive full Medicaid coverage, including coverage for her medications. Mary was able to secure all of her medications and no longer cuts back on doses. Last year, Mary forgot to update her Medicaid application, as required annually by the State. Consequently, she lost her eligibility benefits. WCC's social worker helped her through the confusing application process and she was again enrolled on Medicaid. Without the help of WCC's social worker, Mary would have had to resort to reducing her medications

Tuition Assistance. WCC provides financial tuition aid so young children can receive quality education at our Early Education Center and help parents with their monthly fee.

Emergency Food Pantry helps people with food. Many are still struggling to make ends meet and come to us when their cupboards are bare. We're here to help with non perishable foods, canned goods and support. Many times our pantries are bare and we've been fortunate to have funds to purchase additional foods at a discounted rate. With your help we can keep our Emergency Pantry stocked to help feed hungry families, children and senior adults right here in Hawaii. (Return to top)

Waianae Coast Comprehensive Health Center (WCCHC) is a healing center which provides medical services and traditional healing. It is also one of the largest employers on the Wai`anae Coast. We will tour the health campus as well as their beautifully designed walking trails and Hawaiian Native Garden. Lunch at Kaa`aina Café (Pavilion) with spectacular views of the Waianae Coastline (bring your cameras!). Healthy, local, delicious and freshly made meals (Cash only, no host) offered. Marriott Ihilani before taking over Kaa`aina Café at the Health Center.

Campus Improvement Projects at Waikiki Community Center

Several key projects to improve the capacity and condition of the Center are underway, completed and planned.

We thank the **Waikiki Rotary Club** for their volunteer work day project on Saturday, November 10. A crew of 30 members of the Club, along with volunteers from La Pietra School, cleaned, primed and repainted 3 of the classrooms at the Center that are used by our many local nonprofit organizations and volunteer class instructors. Thanks to our Rotary and La Pietra volunteers – you made our classrooms sparkle and shine for those using our rooms!

The electrical upgrade project, funded by the **Housing and Urban Development and the City and County of Honolulu** is progressing to improve the electrical capacity of the Waikiki Community Center. The completion date of the \$506,000 project has been delayed to April 30, 2013. When this project is completed the Center will have enhanced electrical capability to accommodate future improvements to the facilities.

Commercial Electric, the general contractor, trenched and placed new cables that will connect the new electrical transformer to the new electrical panels. This work was completed in September; Cultural Studies Hawaii monitored the project. This part of the project was completed smoothly.

In October the Center submitted its request to the **State of Hawaii** to ask the Governor for the release of \$230,000 for legislature-approved replacement of roofs, rain gutters and new exterior painting of all 3 buildings on the Center's campus. We are working for the release of these funds, with the hope the improvements will be completed in 2013. (Return to top)
